

ORDINANCE NO. 8

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO OPEN-BURNING BAN
IN FRANKLIN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF FRANKLIN
COUNTY, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Whenever the Division of Forestry of the Commonwealth of Kentucky notifies Franklin County that an extraordinary fire hazard exists in Franklin County as determined by the National Fire Danger Rating System and Fire Occurrence, the County Judge-Executive may proclaim such condition to exist in Franklin County.


Section 2: No person shall, when a proclamation as provided for in Section 1 has been issued, light or maintain an open fire at any location in Franklin County while such proclamation is in effect. Any person violating this section shall be subject to the fines and penalties hereinafter provided.

Section 3. Notice of the proclamation provided for in Section 1 shall be published in the newspaper of largest bona fide circulation in Franklin County.

Section 4. A person who violates this ordinance may be fined a sum not to exceed Five Hundred dollars (\$ 500.00) for each offense of this ordinance.
